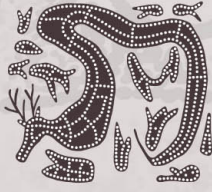

Nyirunggulung – Rise have secured a partnership to deliver a CERT III in civil Construction through the CFMEU, this training is conducted over a year with the focus on hands-on experience on an actual civil project.

The training will be delivered around a real-life civil project. The upgrade of 52 Kms of road leading to the Nipbamjen Waterfalls a tourist site and part of the Jawoyn owned Nitmiluk Park. The site is a significant cultural site and was a birthing story site so the project will link in well with the IWIC program and our partner Jawoyn.

CFMEU CONSTRUCTION

The CFMEU is training 15 women from the IWIC program. The program will deliver training in an identified need for operators in the Central Arnhem region and in mining operations.

As the training is conducted on site the participants will require sleeping swags, sleeping bags, food and washing facilities whilst on site, we have secured the Manyallaluk center to base the participants,

The training will run over a year with alternate weeks of training and on site operations training every month, the initial modules will be delivered in Barunga as they will be Theory, the practical training will start in the second block and continue every month expected to be completed around June 2021.

Jenna White

Is a proud Mardigan woman. Ms White was adopted at birth and found her mob at the age of 27. Her Mother's family is Mardigan tribe hailing from the Charleville and Cunnamulla area of South West Queensland. Ms White is a qualified Plumber, Drainer and Gas Fitter. In 2007 Ms White was indentured into a Plumbing and Gas Fitting Apprenticeship. In the last year of her Apprenticeship she was the first woman and first Indigenous person to win the LPGA Gas Fitting Apprentice of the Year.

In 2015 Jenna was selected in the Queensland Murri Rugby League women's team and toured New Zealand for 16 days. This side was the first Indigenous women's Rugby League side to tour internationally. Jenna has come onboard to Nyirringgulung-Rise as the Project Manager for the Country's first Remote Indigenous Women in Construction Program.

At just 32 years of age, she brings a plethora of knowledge and experience to mentor the 15 women from the Central Arnhem region to complete their Certificate III in Civil Construction (Civil Operations) but also has room to learn and grow from the experiences the 15 women share with her.

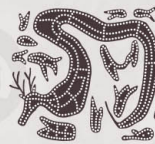
